



2024-2025 Charter Renewal Application Packet – Global Village Academy

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RENEWAL RECOMMENDATION:

It is the recommendation of DCSD staff that the charter contract between Douglas County School District (DCSD) and Global Village Academy be renewed for a term of 5 years.

RENEWAL APPLICATION PROCESS & EVALUATION:

The renewal process provides an opportunity for schools to (1) present any new or supplemental evidence of school performance and (2) articulate school plans and capacities for the next charter term. The charter renewal recommendation to the Board will be based on an array of evidence gathered over the charter term, including data and information collected by Douglas County School District Office of Choice Programming, the Colorado Department of Education, and any supplemental information that the applicant group provides.

The renewal process begins in September when the charter school declares its intent to apply for renewal. No later than September 1, the charter school submits its Renewal Application to the DCSD Office of Choice Programming. All information is presented to the Superintendent’s Cabinet through a compilation of evidence collected through the school’s site visit, an analysis of the school’s educational, operational, and financial health, and any feedback provided to the DCSD Office of Choice Programming by the applicant team upon initial review of this final report.

SCHOOL OVERVIEW

Mission: Global Village Academy students will become fluent and literate in English and a second-world language, excel academically in core content subjects, and develop 21st-century skills, including cross-cultural understanding.

Vision: Global Village Academy is a world-class school that supports P-16 education in English and a second world language and promotes college and workforce readiness in a global economy, as well as 21st-century skills, including the ability to work in cross-cultural situations.

Key Design Elements:

- GVA highlights early language immersion with Kindergarten students receiving content instruction in at least 50% delivered in their chosen world language.
- Multiple community and parent involvement opportunities - International Days, movie nights, global outreach programs (Jeans for Dreams to raise funds for a school in Liberia)
- Positive Behaviors, Interventions, and Support (PBIS) and Zones of Regulation are used to promote Social Emotional Learning
- Overall Rating of EXEMPLARY by outside reviewer and successful annual reports by DCSD

Information Since Last Renewal:

- Parents identified areas of improvement, and the school has worked to address Conflict Resolution, Homework Communication, Authentic Communication with Staff. Improvements made based on feedback.

- Colorado Parents Family Favorite and 5280 Magazine’s Best of Language Immersion Schools
- Increased Planning time (30-minute daily PLC) and Differentiation of Professional Learning in response to feedback from staff
- Awarded the “LabelFrancEducation” distinction by the French Ministry of Foreign Affairs
- Confucius Classroom designation - strengthening Chinese language and culture programs

A review of the past three years shows Global Village Academy has met many of the benchmarks set forth by Douglas County School District, showing good fiscal health. The school is below the Operating Margin Ratio benchmark in 2024. Operating Margin Ratio indicates the amount added to reserves for every \$1 in total general fund gross revenue. Operating Margin has a benchmark of >.01, Global Village Academy has fluctuated over the years from below the benchmark in 2021 with -0.02, to a .06 in 2022 and .08 2023. The school also missed the Change in Fund Balance ratio in 2024, this ratio indicates the change in the general fund balance and a consistent decline is not sustainable. Global Village Academy has fluctuated over the past three years from 2.65 in 2022 1.02 in 2023 down to a -0.11 in 2024. Global Village Academy shows overall good fiscal health and meets all financial deadlines.
