Purpose of Alternative Educator Preparation Programs

In Colorado, designated agencies are allowed to create alternative educator preparation programs to:

- alleviate the educator shortage faced by many school districts
- decrease the issuance of emergency educator authorizations
- provide alternative candidates with adequate supervision and education in teaching methods and practices
- assist in recruiting and employing non-traditional candidates
- provide educator pathways to alternative candidates with experience in areas other than education





- On <u>April 12, 2023</u>, State Board of Education approved and authorized Douglas County School District as a designated agency for alternative teacher preparation, providing a two-year, local program in the following endorsement areas::
 - K-6 Elementary Education
 - Secondary Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources, Business and Marketing, English Language Arts, Family and Consumer Sciences, Mathematics, Middle School Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Technology Education
 - K-12 Computer Science, Dance, Drama, Health, Music, Physical Education, Visual Arts, World Languages
- Program application was peer reviewed and the content was deemed to meet Colorado State Board of Education endorsement standards
- Program content is aligned to CDE's Teacher Quality Standards





Candidate requirements:

- 1. Have at least a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited college or university.
- 2. Apply for and secure a DCSD teaching position.
- 3. Enroll in an alternative licensure program.
- 4. Complete and submit an Alternative License application to the Colorado Department of Education

Benefits of DCSD alternative teaching license program for candidates:

- There is no cost to candidates to participate
- Earn a salary while you complete your teaching program
- Gain experience while you learn the tools of the trade
- Work with a guaranteed support team for 2 years
- For K-3 candidates, complete required READ Act training during the program
- Finish the program with a Professional Teaching License*

^{*}Most alternative licensure programs end with only an Initial License in which teacher must still complete two additional years of induction.


Next Steps




